



Not yet computational and hidden archives: Focus on Eastern/Southeastern Europe


Why Eastern/Southeastern Europe?

- •Main locus of the crime
- Majority of Holocaust victims lived in Eastern Europe
- Local archives often still underexplored and underdescribed
- In places, weak institutional networks and infrastructural support

Conclusions and innovations

- Archives are the RIs for historians
- In the context of historical research physical interaction and digital integration must go hand-in-hand
- Interdisciplinary collaboration is vital (archival scientists, historians and digital humanists)
- Transnational integration enables research innovation and ensures continued remembrance of the Holocaust as a formative European experience



Why EHRI as a long-term RI?

Realise long-term impact of RI

- significance of Holocaust history and education for EU's mission and values
- bridge infrastructural gap (Europe vs. US/Israel)
- incentive to further integrate Holocaust research at national level

... by building on solid foundations

- already a successful integrating activity
- forge links into a long-term consortium to foster service integration, collaboration and knowledge transfers
- EHRI already viewed as long-term infrastructure; services to third-party projects
