

The Impact of Outputs

- Landmark research infrastructures with track records of policy engagement:
- ESS data helped develop EU indicators of public confidence in justice
- SHARE used by multiple DGs for policy development and expenditure prediction
- CESSDA influences national data strategies and sets the benchmarks for cross-national data use





And The Impact of Inputs...

In other words...

- In the region of 5000 persons per round
- And because of labour turnover much higher number of individuals
- Then add in academics and students on courses using ESS/SHARE or any CESSDAarchived data
- 89,000 registered users of ESS alone
