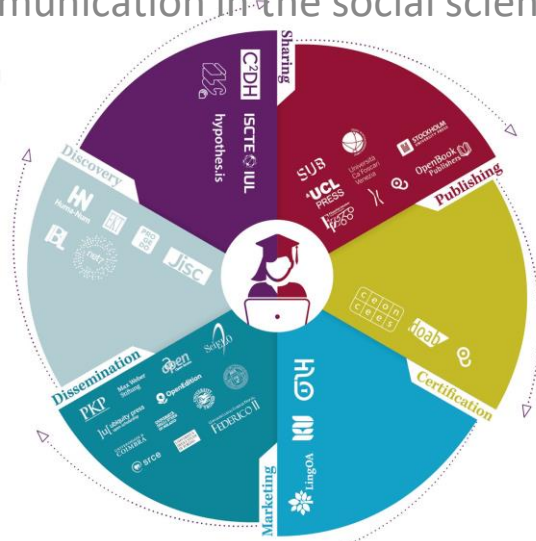


# OPERAS Research Infrastructure

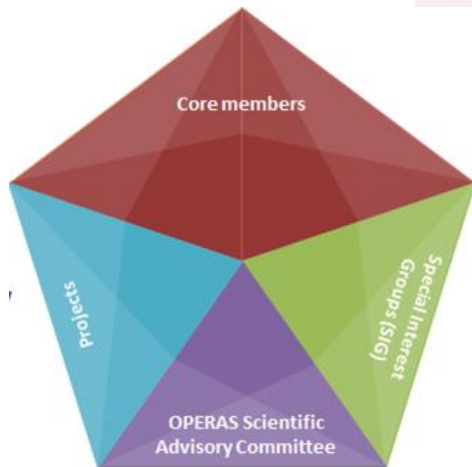
The development of new projects is a very efficient way of involving new partners
